Greetings!

In less than five years, we have achieved phenomenal success in advancing the adaptive reuse of a municipal asset, that has been abandoned for almost 70 years, into a walking, running, and biking trail. The abandoned rail line was originally known as the Stock Yard Line and later known as the "Kenwood 'L' Embankment." According to former Chicago Department Planning & Development Commissioner, Mr. Maurice Cox, the "Bronzeville Cultural Trail" will induce over \$1 Billion dollars of investment in Bronzeville and the near south side of the City of Chicago.

Our four major accomplishments thus far have been:

- 1. January 2023, we assisted in the completion of a \$250,000 feasibility study, ordered by the Chicago Department of Planning & Development, to repurpose the embankment. We helped organize a community forum, where said feasibility study was presented, and
- 2. In October 2024, the City of Chicago made a \$5 million dollar commitment to activate the project by investing in the preparation of a "Framework Plan" and, upon its completion, invest in "Phase One Construction," and
- 3. In October 2024, we were awarded a 3-year, \$900,000 grant by the Mellon Foundation to conduct archival research on the history of the former "Stockyard Line" and to study its related landscape and habitat, and
- 4. On June 25, 2025, we successfully launching a summer enrichment program in partnership with Illinois Tech and Dawson Technical Institute, called the "Bronzeville Trail Design Studio: Enrichment Program" where 15 young people ages 16 - 24 years old will attend a six-week course and are paid by One Summer Chicago.

With deep gratitude and great anticipation, we cordially invite you to attend our third Installation and Awards Luncheon as a proud supporter of this important health initiative. Our time together will be a powerful convergence of thought leaders, community practitioners, policymakers, advocates, philanthropists, and neighbors, all working collaboratively to bring a healthier future to the residents of Bronzeville and the near south side of Chicago.

Ciere Boatright Keynote Speaker

Ms. Ciere Boatright was appointed commissioner of the Chicago Department of Planning Development (DPD) in November 2023 by Mayor Brandon Johnson. An experienced real estate and economic development executive, Boatright is for leading responsible DPD's economic development, planning and zoning functions while promoting inclusive, equitable growth across the city. Local business publications have named her among Notable Women in Commercial Real Estate, 40 under 40, Notable Black Leaders and Executives, and Notable Executives of Color in Construction and Commercial Real Estate.

Mr Monieson is CEO of UICO LLC, an industrial monitor company located in Elmhurst Illinois. Active in the Chicago startup ecosystem, Doug is Chairman Emeritus of Hyde Park Angels, one of the largest angel groups in the Midwest and serves on the Board of the University of Chicago Polsky Center for Entrepreneurship and the Kaplan Institute for Entrepreneurship at Illinois Institute of Technology in Bronzeville. He is a Board Member of the Bronzeville Trail Task Force and National Treasurer and Board Member of the Rails to Trails Conservancy (RTC), a Washington D.C. think tank that advocates for building a nation connected by trails. Event Awardees

In recognition of their service and commitment to the Bronzeville Trail Task Force, we are pleased to celebrate this year's awardees:



Toni Preckwinkle

Ms. Preckwinkle is the 35th president of the Cook County Board of Commissioners, an office she has held since 2010. She is the first Black woman to be elected to the office. President Preckwinkle was one of the first elected officials to lend her support the Bronzeville Trail Development Project and was a former alderman of the ward where the rail embankment resides.



Maria Villalobos-Hernandez

Ms. Villalobos-Hernandez is an Associate Professor, Director of the Master of Landscape Architecture and Urbanism, at Illinois Tech College of Architecture. NAMLA Board of Directors DMU NAMLA, ASLA. Ms. Villalobos-Hernandez began teaching a course using the embankment in her landscape architecture course before she became aware of any effort to repurpose the embankment into a linear park. Villalobos-Hernandez served as one of the founding members of the BTTF Development Committee.



Vernon Williams

Mr. Vernon Williams, Architect of several buildings in Chicago and Bronzeville, has over 43 years of experience in the built environment. He was the first design professional to get involved with the Bronzeville Trail Project and served on its Development Committee.

Bronzeville Trail Design Studio

Our summer enrichment program is a 6-week immersive experience, designed to give high school students and young adults the opportunity to learn about making a real impact in the community. In partnership with Illinois Tech and Dawson Technical Institute, we launched hands-on programs that dive into urban design, community research, and creative prototyping. We are proud to have 15 students enrolled in the program, while also earning compensation through One Summer Chicago.


